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PPG completes COLOURFUL COMMUNTIES project at Kurrambee School in Sydney

MELBOURNE, Australia, February 19, 2020 – PPG (NYSE:PPG) today announced the completion of a COLOURFUL COMMUNITIES® project at Kurrambee School in Werrington, Sydney that revitalised the classrooms of the more than 100 special needs students who attend the school. The project brought together more than 45 PPG volunteers, who spent two days transforming the classrooms into fresh and engaging learning spaces.

PPG provided more than \$14,250 in products and tools to support the project, including 1,265 litres of TAUBMANS® paint by PPG. Damage to walls and doorframes was also repaired, with assistance from the team at FJS Plastering & Interiors, who donated their time and services.

The Colourful Communities program provides PPG volunteers and products along with financial contributions to bring colour and vitality to communities where the company operates around the world, such as Sydney, where PPG has an architectural paint manufacturing plant situated in the suburb of Villawood.

Taubmans colour experts collaborated with the school principal and staff to select colours for the classroom walls, which were covered with plaster and peeling paint. Cognizant of potential visual triggers for some students, a neutral colour palette of *Taubmans* Miss Universe, Time Cap and Illusive White was chosen. *Taubmans* ALL WEATHER® exterior paint was used to refresh the external window frames, doors and walls. *Taubmans* Endure interior paint, the brand's premium interior paint, was used to brighten the classroom walls and *Taubmans* TRADEX® ceiling paint on the ceilings.
